07 - 08 September 2021 Design, Maintenance and Construction of Highways Drainage Systems

The increasing frequency of flooding and a growing awareness of the effects of climate change are drivers towards a greater recognition of the importance of effective surface water drainage systems. This two day course provides up-to-date information on current practice, legislation, and standards.

13 September 2021 Designing for Buses in the Urban Environment

This one-day course will highlight common mistakes that can occur during the planning and design of bus interchanges and infrastructure. Exploring issues that may at first appear minor, but if not identified and addressed early can result in challenging and costly remedial work during all phases of the project

14 September 2021 Participation and Consultation in Transport Planning

This course sets out what responsible organisations must do to enable inclusive development. In addition, and possibly even more important, it demonstrates, through practical case studies, the difference between running public participation well and running it badly.

15 September 2021 Technical Report Writing

Many professionals lack confidence in their report-writing skills, and feel that their credibility suffers because their written reports are not a fair reflection of their expertise. This course is perfect for anyone looking to improve their technical report writing skills.

21 September 2021 Essential Legislation for Transport Planners

The legislation affecting transport practitioners is wide ranging, with often serious consequences for non-compliance. Covering the main duties, powers and obligations placed on practitioners by UK legislation, this course provides an essential insight into the distinction between law and guidance and the risks that can arise.

21 - 22 September 2021 Highway Design and Construction

Continuing cut-backs and restraint in funding of highway construction and maintenance has led to even greater need for practitioners to gain an appreciation and understanding of cost-effective highway design, specification and implementation. This two-day course will guide participants through highway design and construction.

23 September 2021 Successful Planning Applications

All transport planners are required to prepare and review transport assessments. This easily digestible course provides a fundamental overview on the operation of the planning system in England. Delegates will receive practical advice and leave with a strong understanding of the process.

27 - 28 September 2021 Cycling for Transport

The increasing concerns over reducing road congestion and lowering NO2 levels throughout the country is just one of the factors behind the desire to increase the use of cycling as a main mode of transportation. This course is designed to provide a solid introduction to cycling considerations

28 - 29 September 2021 Transport Modelling for Non-Modellers

Is transport modelling something of an unknown quantity that you need to know more about? This course provides an indispensable introduction for anyone from a non-modelling background, and is designed for those managing transportation projects that involve an element of modelling.

29 September 2021 Statistical Techniques for Transport Planners

Do you need to analyse and manipulate data as part of your transport planning project? Packed with hands on exercises, and supported by useful reference material, this one day course is a must for anyone wishing to increase their confidence in practical mathematics

30 September 2021 Urban Logistics and Transport Planning

Efficient, safe and sustainable movement of freight within urban areas is essential to ensure towns and cities prosper and local businesses thrive. Freight is the lifeblood of our local economies and needs to be planned for and effectively managed, to balance the needs of industry with those of local communities.
