Speaker Profile

Speaker: The Honourable CHEUNG Kin-chung, Matthew GBM, GBS, JP

The Honourable CHEUNG Kin-chung, Matthew GBM, GBS, JP was the Chief Secretary for Administration (CS) of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government (HKSARG) from January 2017 until June 2021 when he left the government after serving Hong Kong for nearly 50 years, making him the longest serving government official in Hong Kong's history.

Mr. Cheung joined the Hong Kong Government as an Information Officer in the Government Information Services (GIS) in July 1972 on graduation from The University of Hong Kong. He became Commissioner for Labour in 1999; Director of Education in 2000; and Permanent Secretary for Economic Development and Labour in 2002. He took up the political appointment of Secretary for Labour and Welfare in July 2007 and served for almost 10 years until January 2017 when he was appointed CS. He served as CS till June 2021.

Mr. Cheung is currently Adjunct Professor of the Faculty of Social Sciences at The University of Hong Kong; Honorary Professor of the Department of Social Sciences and Policy Studies at The Education University of Hong Kong; and Adjunct Professor of the Asia-Pacific Institute of Ageing Studies at The Lingnan University Hong Kong. He is also a Fellow of the Hong Kong Management Association.
