Message from the President

Dear CILTHK Members,

I am Ir Prof. Sam CHOW, the current President of the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport in Hong Kong (CILTHK). I have been working in the transport consulting field for 38 years since graduating in Civil Engineering in Melbourne, Australia. In 1986, I began my career with Wilbur Smith Associates (WSA), an American

international transport consulting firm in Hong Kong. WSA developed the first Comprehensive Transport Study (CTS) model for Hong Kong between 1973 and 1976. I utilised the CTS model for several significant transport infrastructure and planning projects in the 1980s, including the Tate's Cairn Tunnel, the Cross Harbour Link of the Kowloon-Canton Railway, the Tuen Mun/Yuen Long Light Rail Transit Urban Link, Container Terminals No. 8 and 9, the North Lantau Development Study, Route 3, and the Tsing Ma Bridge/Lantau Highway. Remarkably, most of these projects were implemented shortly after the studies. Additionally, I participated in the planning of the Hong Kong International Airport in Lantau as part of the Ports and Airport Development Strategy Study in the late 1980s.

In the 1990s, I worked on numerous toll road studies in Mainland China, completing about 50 studies across 10 provinces. Concurrently, I led several major studies in Hong Kong, including the Electronic Road Pricing Feasibility Study, the Third Comprehensive Transport Study (CTS-3), and transport planning for the West Rail Sham Shui Po section as a director at WSA.

In the first decade of the new millennium, leveraging my experience from CTS-3, I worked on various comprehensive transport and metro studies in Beijing, Hangzhou, Shenzhen, Tianjin, Suzhou, Xiamen, and Foshan. In the 2010s, I joined Arup, leading their transport consulting business in the East Asia Region. Our team expanded into several Mainland Chinese and Southeast Asian cities, conducting numerous transport planning studies for developments and infrastructure projects, including metro systems, highways, airports, walkability, and public transport, in cities across Mainland China,

Vietnam, the Philippines, Thailand, Malaysia, Cambodia, Laos, Indonesia, India, and Timor-Leste.

I became a Chartered Member of CILTHK in 1990 after passing nine papers in the Qualifying Examination. I joined the Council in 1999 and was elected as a Fellow of CILTHK in 2006. Since then, I have chaired committees such as Transport Planning Policy and Professional Activities and Marketing, and participated in several other committees before being elected President of CILTHK last October.

I am also an Adjunct Professor in the Department of Geography at the University of Hong Kong (2021-2025) and was a Guest Professor at the School of Civil Engineering and Transportation, South China University of Technology (2014-2017). I have actively given lectures at the University of Hong Kong, the Chinese University of Hong Kong, The Hong Kong Polytechnic University, the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, the MTR Academy in Hong Kong, the National Science and Technology Development Agency in Thailand, and the Vietnamese-German University in Vietnam. In 2021, I was appointed as a dissertation supervisor for the Master of Arts in Transport Policy & Planning at the University of Hong Kong. I was also a member of the Academic Committee Meeting (2023) and am the Academic Assessor for the Professional Diploma in Logistics and Transport Management for HKU School of Professional and Continuing Education (SPACE) (2025-2027). I was appointed as a Strategy Consultant in Urban Traffic Planning by the Zhuhai Municipal People's Government (2012-2018) and am currently a member of the Road Safety Research Committee (2017-Present) and the Harbourfront Commission (2021-Present) appointed by the HKSAR Government.

Throughout my nearly 40 years of experience, I have been fortunate to witness and contribute to the growth and development of Hong Kong, our country, and our neighboring regions.

Looking ahead, I am confident that there are still many opportunities for CILTHK members to contribute their professional transport and logistics skills and experience to Hong Kong, the Greater Bay Area, and the broader region.

CILTHK welcomes Policy Address 2024 Initiatives on Transport and Logistics Development



The Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China

The Chief Executive's 2024 Policy Address

2024.10.16

The CILTHK welcomes the Chief Executive's 2024 Policy Address and its focus on taking forward the transport and logistics related policies and infrastructure such as enhancing Hong Kong's position as an International Shipping Centre and International Aviation Hub. We are particularly encouraged by the initiatives addressing nine key areas critical to the industry's arowth and competitiveness.

1. Take Forward Development of the Northern Metropolis

We are pleased to see that the Northern Metropolis will gradually enter its maturity phase. With the completion of the new Huanggang Port building, which will feature co-location of immigration and customs clearance, the cross-boundary travel experience between Hong Kong and Shenzhen will be greatly enhanced. In the long term, the Northern Link Main Line and the Northern Metropolis Highway (San Tin Section) will become crucial east-west transport links within the Northern Metropolis, creating the necessary conditions for its development in terms of transportation. This will significantly boost our economic growth and bolster our technology industries, and the Northern Metropolis will become the new engine of Hong Kong's economic development.

2. Promote Major Transport Infrastructure Development

We fully support the Government in actively following through with the Major Transport Infrastructure Development Blueprint for Hong Kong, especially as cross-boundary railway projects are being advanced at full speed. Hung Shui Kiu Station will be the starting point of the Hong Kong Shenzhen Western Rail Link in Hong Kong, providing a rapid railway link directly to Qianhai in Shenzhen. This will be a crucial cross-boundary railway corridor between the western parts of Hong Kong and Shenzhen, and important for the development of the western Northern Metropolis. The Northern Link Spur Line, extending from the San Tin station of the Northern Link Main Line, will further enhance the accessibility of the Huanggang Port, strengthening its role as a key cross-boundary crossing in the central corridor between Hong Kong and Shenzhen, and enhancing the linkage between the two cities.

3. Build Smart and Green Mass Transit Systems

Smart and Green Mass Transit Systems have been under study in Hong Kong for several years. We are pleased to see and support the government in promptly initiating the construction of these Smart and Green Mass Transit Systems, and in compressing the time required for construction. Notably, the government has clearly stated that the Kai Tak project will be completed three years ahead of the original target completion date. This will significantly enhance the transport services in the Kai Tak Development, providing the necessary transport infrastructure for the development of the region. Additionally, together with the East Kowloon and Hung Shui Kiu/Ha Tsuen projects, we are pleased to see that travel in Hong Kong is becoming much greener, making a significant contribution to the city's sustainable development and environmental ecology.

4. Promote Development of New Energy

Green transport is a future that everyone in Hong Kong looks forward to. Due to the high capital costs, the transition to new energy in Hong Kong's transport industry has encountered some difficulties, and operators in the industry generally face significant financial pressure. We support and are pleased to see that the Government will earmark around \$750 million under the New Energy Transport Fund to subsidise the taxi trade and franchised bus companies to purchase electric vehicles and launch the Subsidy Scheme for Trials of Hydrogen Fuel Cell Electric Heavy Vehicles. This will greatly help the industry transition to new energy, reduce costs, and thus realise the vision of 'Zero-carbon Emissions - Liveable City - Sustainable Development' in Hong Kong.

5. Supporting to Logistics Land Supply

We applaud the government's commitment to creating more land for logistics development. This crucial step would alleviate the longstanding issue of land scarcity and support the expansion of modern logistics facilities. The four quality logistics sites, for example, are instrumental for the industry to develop modern, high end, multi storey logistics facilities. Hung Shui Kiu/Ha Tsuen NDAs are ideal locations for warehousing, logistics and value-added activities connecting the Northern Metropolis for the pilot logistics park.

6. Modern Logistics Development

We fully support the development of green maritime hub and aviation hub. Promoting the green transformation of registered ships and offering green fuel bunkering facilities are paramount to advancing Hong Kong to a truly green maritime hub. Additionally, the setting of a target for sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) consumption would speed up the reduction of carbon emissions by the aviation industry and cater to the increasing demand of international airlines for SAF; while developing SAF and green maritime fuel supply chains would formulate a long term plan and visibility for industry development in respect of fuel supply and demand, storage and bunkering. The emphasis on developing new quality productive forces, including the establishment of the Working Group on Developing Low Altitude Economy (LAE), echoes CILTHK's suggestions on embracing innovation across the logistics sector. The exploration of LAE flying application scenario, including drone parcel delivery, eVTOL and autonomous technology in logistics aligns with our industry's push towards innovation. We look forward to collaborating on initiatives that would enhance efficiency and reduce costs in the logistics sector.

7. Strengthening Hong Kong's Maritime Leadership

The policy address's focus on developing Hong Kong into a high value-added maritime centre is commendable. We are

particularly excited about several key initiatives that would significantly enhance Hong Kong's maritime capabilities and global competitiveness. For example, the establishment of the Hong Kong Maritime and Port Development Board is a crucial step forward. This high-level advisory body would play a pivotal role in assisting the government in formulating policies and long-term development strategies for the maritime sector. While the enhancement and promotion of tax concessions is a welcome move that would undoubtedly strengthen the local maritime ecosystem. These financial incentives would make Hong Kong an even more attractive destination for maritime businesses, fostering growth and innovation within the industry. Another significant initiative on attracting maritime service enterprises to establish a presence in Hong Kong and recognising the critical importance of developing maritime services talents would further strengthen the competitiveness of Hong Kong as a high value-added maritime centre.

8. Leverage the strength of the Greater Bay Area (GBA)

We are encouraged to see that the government's effort in strengthen co-operation in the logistics sector with the western part of Guangdong and other neighbouring areas, through making good use of the Hong Kong Zhuhai Macao Bridge to expand the catchment area of our cargo services and facilitate more goods to go through Hong Kong. In addition, the HKIA Dongguan Logistics Park capitalise on land resources in GBA and proximity to the hinterland, and provide cost effective solution for shippers, freight forwarders and airlines. We look forward to more innovative intermodal arrangements for cargo similar to "Fly Via Zhuhai Hong Kong" in future.

9. Modernising the Regulatory Framework for Enhanced Efficiency

The proposed study on extending the Air Transhipment Cargo Exemption Scheme for Specified Strategic Commodities to other intermodal transshipment modes is essential as it would facilitate transshipment declaration and permit application. Besides, the exponential growth of e-commerce necessitates a strategic focus on attracting dedicated customs clearance, trade declaration, cargo flights and expanding logistics operations to capitalise on this trend. The review of procedures relevant to cross-border e-commerce would improve the efficiency of customs clearance, good declaration and return. These initiatives would reduce bureaucratic hurdles and enhance Hong Kong's attractiveness as a cross-boundary logistics hub.



Formation of Low Altitute Economy Task Force

CILTHK Launches Task Force to Advance Low Altitude Economy

CILTHK has established a Task Force to support the HKSAR Government's initiative to develop a low-altitude economy (LAE). This initiative aims to address transport and logistics needs crucial for the sector's growth in Hong Kong.

Key Objectives of the LAE Task Force:

- 1. Research and Recommendations: Engage in research and discussions to provide informed recommendations to the government.
- 2. Logistics Analysis: Examine Hong Kong's logistics framework to identify opportunities for enhancement.
- 3. Transport Assessment: Assess existing transport systems to optimise operations for LAE demands.
- 4. Greater Bay Area Integration: Explore LAE integration within the Greater Bay Area for regional collaboration.

Chaired by Dr. Isaac K.C. NG, FCILT, the Task Force includes notable members such as:

With a wealth of experience in the e-commerce logistics industry, Mr. CHAN has played pivotal roles at DHL for over a decade, spearheading developments in the Chinese market. Currently serving as the Managing Director at YunExpress, his insights proved invaluable. The topic covered YunExpress's



achievements in cross-border e-commerce logistics since its establishment in 2014. With a global reach, the company has navigated customs challenges and last-mile delivery successfully, establishing itself as a significant player in Asia Pacific, Europe, and notably in the America. YunExpress embodies adaptability and success in the dynamic industry landscape. Participants were provided with a unique opportunity to gain deeper insights into the challenges within US e-commerce logistics.

It is my great honour to receive the Young Executive Award at The Hong Kong's NextGen Logistician Awards 2024 ceremony on 19 November at ALMAC, another major award in the logistics industry after my first CILTHK Young Achiever Award 11 years ago. This is a new award advocated by the Transport and Logistics Bureau as part of the Action Plan on Modern Logistics Development and I am glad to be one of the first awardees.

The recognition of my professional capacities and substantial contributions made to the development of Hong Kong's logistics industry makes me feel prestigious and it is a remarkable milestone of my career. Since graduated from HKUST BBA program, I joined the Hong Kong branch of a long-established UK private company, being the second staff in the Far East, started my career in logistics field from scratch in the freight operations. Over the last 21 years, I have come up from the ranks to become the youngest and non-Brit main board director in CKF's history, with no kinship to the owner's family. Currently I am the Director - Asia & Middle East looking after both regions' interest for the company.

Passing the torch to the next generation is very important to our industry, the young talents are in needed of valuable advice from the seniors to move up their careers. I joined Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport in Hong Kong in 2010, awarded Young Achiever of the year 2013 and awarded "Highly Commended" in the International Young Achiever of the year 2014 from CILT International. Since then, I had been highly involved in the Next Generation committee, organising mentorship programs, approached different industrial leaders to be the mentors for the students. Advancing to a higher level in

my career, I was also part of the mentors' team to share my experience to the students in different occasions.

Giving back to the industry has always been in my mind, the more advanced in my career, I had spent more time to contribute to the industry. In 2020, I was nominated into CILTHK Council, appointed as Chairman of Logistics Policy Committee and upgraded to a Chartered Fellow. Leading the team of experts from both academic and practical fields, we provided suggestions to both government Policy Address and Budget from the logistics stakeholders' perspective. We conducted a lot of research related to concurrent issues in logistics sector, including cold chain, aviation security and maritime development of Hong Kong, wrote a lot of position paper and submitted to the government. In May 2022, we held a press conference addressing the "Imperative Need of Land for Logistics Industry in Northern Metropolis and Tuen Mun West" in the Office of the Hon Frankie YICK. In August 2024, a press release of a survey with in-depth analysis for more than a year on the ESG practices in Hong Kong logistics industry has been published in different media and shared with TLB. In the same month, I am representing CILTHK to be the consultant to participate in the interview with AISCL of CUHK in the study of ESG for logistics industry in Hong Kong. Being a Vice President of CILTHK, I will continue to serve and lead the way to promote and enhance the Hong Kong logistics industry from strength to strength through different activities in the industry and promote to overseas.

I would like to extend my gratitude to CILTHK who has supported me in my career and being a very good platform for continuous learning which enhance me to an advanced career in the industry.

Introduction of CILTHK Accredited Programme delivered by HKU SPACE

1. Higher Diploma in Global Supply Chain Management
